


New Testament Canon: Developments

4 Gospels, Acts, 13 Letters of Paul, 1-2 John, Jude, and Revelation


Step Two: IRENAEUS/Bishop of Lyons



4 Gospels, Acts, 13 Letters of Paul, 1 Peter, 1-2 John, Jude, and Revelation


New Testament Canon: Developments

4 Gospels, Acts, 13 Letters of Paul, Hebrews, 1 Peter, 1 John, Jude, and Revelation [23]


Step Four: ORIGEN




First to Refer to All 27 New Testament Books ORALLY

Criteria for Canonicity

APOSTOLICITY (Authorship)

a book written by an apostle, someone associated with an apostle, or someone connected to Jesus

ORTHODOXY (Content)

a book that does not contradict any other scripture




Criteria for Canonicity


CATHOLICITY (Application)

a book that enjoyed widespread acceptance for a long

period of time
